This insightful talk was a part of the Academic Field Trip Program, where students engaged in a dynamic discussion led by with Mr. Kishore Rai, (Assistant Professor, and Department of Humanities & Social Sciences) at our ICFAI University, Sikkim. The program proved highly interactive, discussing fundamental values, judgment, second chances, psychological impact, mistakes, and motivation on an individual level. Both faculties engaged in lively discussions, eliciting varied opinions from the students who were actively involved, raising questions throughout the event.

The talk also featured a panel discussion with four Ph.D. scholars. Topics covered included justice in society and its impact on human values and economic stability, discrimination based on religion, advocating judgment on the basis of good and bad debts rather than religion, and the importance of respecting humanity in the context of Artificial Intelligence.

Additionally, the scholars delved into government welfare schemes designed to uplift marginalized communities. The overall experience was deemed highly interactive, knowledgeable, and fruitful, providing a platform for diverse perspectives on human values.
