Inter-Semester Public Speaking Competition

The competition was judged by Faculty members (School of Legal Studies) Mr. Rinchen Tamang, Assistant Professor and Dr. Kailesh Sharma, Assistant Professor who assessed participants on criteria such as content, relevance of the theme, clarity, legal reasoning, delivery, and confidence.

After a closely contest, Miss Aastha Sapkota from (BA.LLB, IX Semester) emerged as the winner, followed by Mr. Ayush Kumar Bose from (BA.LLB, IX) Semester in second place, and Kipa Chungma, also from BA.LLB IX Semester, securing third place.
