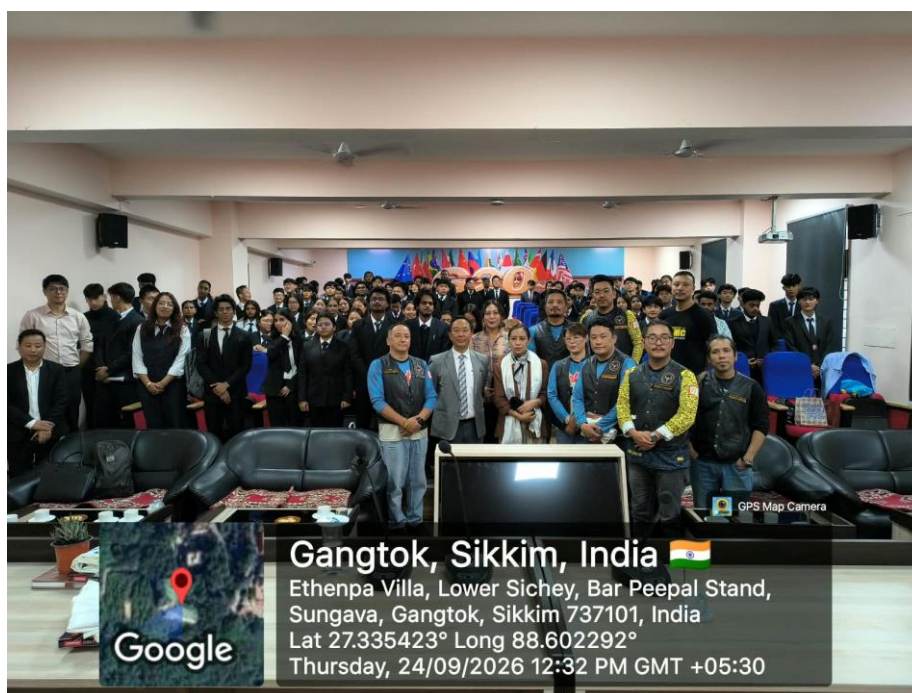




Awareness Programme on Financial Literacy and Road Safety Held at The ICFAI University, Sikkim



As part of the promotional activities leading up to the Sikkim Riders Meet 2026, the Dirty Angels Motorcycle Club (DAMC) organised an awareness programme on Financial Literacy and Road Safety at The ICFAI University, Sikkim, on Thursday.
